Sub-On Table Extubation of Carcinoma of Left Buccal Mucosa Surgery

35 year old male patient presented with complaints of ulcer over the left buccal mucosa since 2 months to ESIC model hospital, Peenya. Punch biopsy was suggestive of squamous cell carcinoma of left buccal mucosa. Patient was planned for left composite resection with modified neck dissection II with pectoralis major myocutaneous flap reconstruction(Arch preserving mandibulectomy) under the guidance of Medical superintendent Dr. Veena Kumari, Oncosurgeon Dr. Anup, Anaesthetist Dr. Jayaprakash S, OT, ICU and CSSD Team. Invasive lines CVC and arterial line secured. Under General anaesthesia, the operative procedure was carried out on 14/3/2025. Adequate blood products were arranged. Intraoperatively patient haemodynamics were maintained. Patient was successfully extubated at the end of the procedure and shifted to ICU. The procedure was performed successfully without tracheostomy.

Patient was managed conservatively with blood products, Iv fluids and O2 supplementation. Patient improved over the course of time. All invasive lines were removed and patient was ambulated. Clear fluids were started on POD2 through NG tube. With excellent intra and postoperative management, patient recovered in the ICU and was shifted to ward.
